Statewide Voter Registration List – Available Fields

When creating reports in the Statewide Voter Registration List there are many different result fields available depending on what information you want to find. Here is a list of all possible fields your report can produce and a brief explanation of each when needed.

Eligible Voters

Field Names

- VoterID – random sequence of numbers assigned to each voter on the report for identification purposes.
- County – the county in which the voter is registered.
- First Name
- Middle Name
- Last Name
- Suffix
- Birth Date
- Registration Date – the date on which the voter registered in the county. It is possible that the registration date shown may not reflect the individual's original registration date in Nevada due to movement between counties and other periodic updates to the particular voter registration record.
 - If any questions arise regarding particular registration dates in regards to specific individuals, please contact the respective county clerk/registrar for clarification.

- County Status – this is the status of the voter as determined by the respective county clerk/registrar. This status can be one of the following:
 - Active – An eligible voter whose residence address is current.
 - Inactive – A voter whose mail is returned from the address at which he registered to vote and has not provided a County Elections Official with a new residence address. Inactive voters retain the legal right to vote, but need not be mailed election material.
 - P-17 – A voter who was under age 18 at the time his voter registration was submitted, but who will be age 18 or older by election day and who has met all other legal requirements to vote.
 - Note: Voters with another status which deems them ineligible (such as cancelled or void) are not part of the official statewide voter registration database of eligible voters.

- **County Voter ID** – This is the unique identifier used by the county that this voter is registered with. This number is only unique for that county and not necessarily unique across the entire state-wide list. The numeric VoterID column that is included in each voter record in this data download *will* be unique across all voters for the entire state.
- **ID Required** – A "Y" in this column indicates that the registered voter may vote at a polling place only if the person presents to the polling place election officer some form of official identification to establish identity as defined in NAC 293.395. An "N" in this column indicates that the registered voter does not need to provide identification.

Voter History

When you run a report to see voter participation history you receive two reports. The first report contains the voter's personal information (the fields described above). The second report contains dates of elections the voter participated in and the voting method they used.

Field Names

- **VotingHistoryID** – random sequence of numbers assigned to each election a voter participated in for tracking purposes in this report.
- **VoterID** – sequence of numbers assigned to each voter used to identify and match voters between the two reports.
 - Example: In the Eligible Voters report voter "Joe Smith" has VoterID 12345. Joe Smith will also have VoterID 12345 in the Voter History report. Match the VoterID numbers in each report to see which elections Joe Smith participated in.
- **Election Date** – date of the general or primary election the voter participated in.
- **Vote Code** – This is the 2-character code to indicate the voter's method of voting for the given election:

Code	Description
MB	MAIL BALLOT COUNTED
EV	EARLY VOTED
PP	POLLING PLACE VOTED
PV	PROVISIONAL
FW	FEDERAL WRITE-IN
BR	BALLOT RECEIVED
SB	BALLOT SENT
