STATE BALLOT QUESTIONS	
<b>State Question 1</b> <b>Amendment to the Nevada Constitution</b> <b>– Marsy's Law</b>	
<p><b>Shall the Nevada Constitution be amended to: (1) remove existing provisions that require the Legislature to provide certain statutory rights for crime victims; and (2) adopt in their place certain expressly stated constitutional rights that crime victims may assert throughout the criminal or juvenile justice process?</b></p>	
<b>YES</b> – Replace existing Nevada Constitution provisions of certain statutory rights with new state constitutional rights that crime victims may assert throughout the criminal or juvenile justice process.	
<b>NO</b> – Keep existing provisions of the Nevada Constitution that require the Legislature to provide certain statutory rights for crime victims.	

<b>State Question 2</b> <b>Amendment to the Sales and Use Tax Act of 1955</b> <b>– Exemption of Feminine Hygiene Products from Sales Tax</b>	
<p><b>Shall the Sales and Use Tax Act of 1955 be amended to provide an exemption from the taxes imposed by this Act on the gross receipts from the sale and the storage, use or other consumption of feminine hygiene products?</b></p>	
<b>Yes</b> – Exempt feminine hygiene products from the Sales and Use Tax Act of 1955, the Local School Support Tax Law and certain analogous sales and use taxes.	
<b>No</b> – Keep the current provisions of the Sales and Use Tax Act of 1955, the Local School Support Tax Law and certain analogous sales and use taxes.	

<b>State Question 3</b> <b>Amendment to Article 1 of the Nevada Constitution</b> <b>– The Energy Choice Initiative</b>	
<p><b>Shall the Nevada Constitution be amended to require an open, competitive retail electric energy market?</b></p>	
<b>YES</b> – Monopolies are bad for the economy and contribute to high consumer prices.	
<b>NO</b> – There is no evidence that prices would be lower and less regulation can cause safety problems.	

<b>State Question 4</b> <b>Amendment to Article 10 of the Nevada Constitution</b> <b>– Medical Patient Tax Relief Act</b>	
<p><b>Shall the Nevada Constitution be amended to exclude taxes on prescribed medical equipment like oxygen and mobility devices?</b></p>	
<b>YES</b> – People who are sick have enough expenses without asking them to pay taxes on things they need to breathe and move.	
<b>NO</b> – Getting rid of this tax will cause a decrease in public revenue that is used to fund services like schools and police departments.	

<b>State Question 5</b> <b>Amendment to Title 24 of the Nevada Revised Statutes</b> <b>– The Automatic Voter Registration Initiative</b>	
<p><b>Shall Chapter 293 of the Nevada Revised Statutes be amended to establish a system that will automatically register an eligible person to vote, or update that person's existing Nevada voter registration information, at the time the person applies to the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles for the issuance or renewal of any type of driver's license or identification card, or makes a request to change the address on such a license or identification card, unless the person affirmatively declines in writing?</b></p>	
<b>YES</b> – Automatically register an eligible person to vote, or update that person's existing Nevada voter registration information.	
<b>NO</b> – Do not automatically register an eligible person to vote, or update that person's existing Nevada voter registration information.	

<b>State Question 6</b> <b>Amendment to the Nevada Constitution</b> <b>– The Renewable Energy Promotion Initiative</b>	
<p><b>Shall Article 4 of the Nevada Constitution be amended to require, beginning in calendar year 2022, that all providers of electric utility services who sell electricity to retail customers for consumption in Nevada generate or acquire incrementally larger percentages of electricity from renewable energy resources so that by calendar year 2030 not less than 50 percent of the total amount of electricity sold by each provider to its retail customers in Nevada comes from renewable energy resources?</b></p>	
<b>YES</b> – Require electric utility services to use more renewable energy.	
<b>NO</b> – Continue to generate electricity from current resources.
